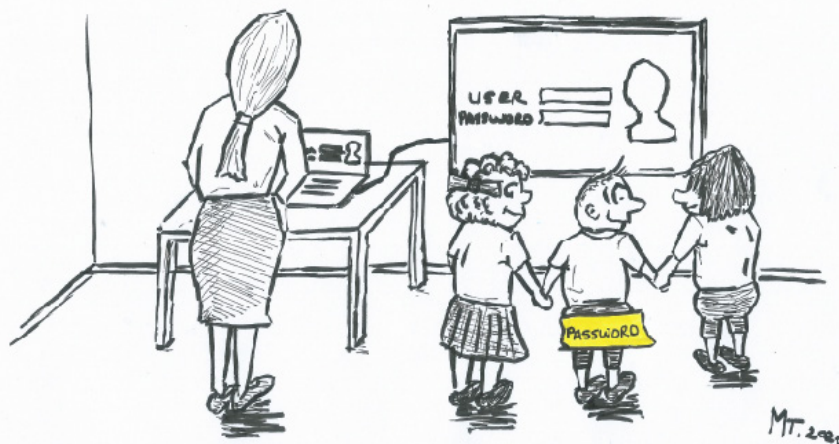

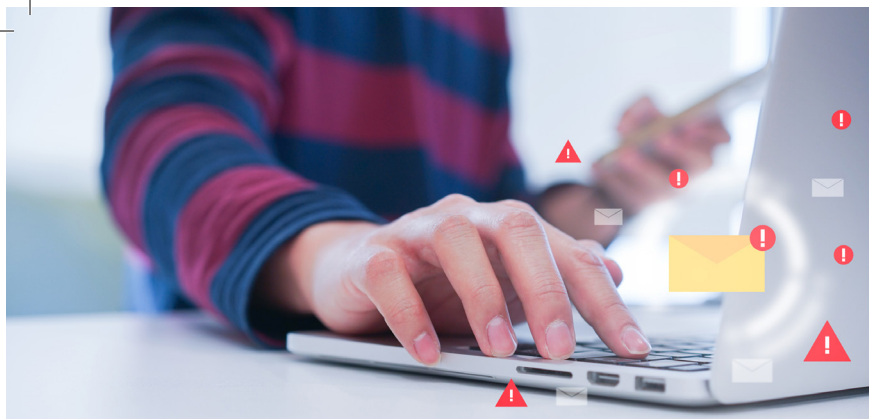

FOCUS: SECURITY

Did you know that your school IT security is currently at a higher risk of being hijacked than ever before? With some staff still working from home and school laptops being used off site, security of your network can be compromised, without you being aware. Are you aware of the pitfalls that are out there, catching out staff, and jeopardising your security? When staff are working from home, and more lessons being participated in on-line, sometimes the overall necessity of security can be forgotten or diluted. Are you 100% certain that all staff have updated their laptops to the latest Windows security patches? Are all antivirus updates done? Where are staff saving their work? Is it safe, are you secure?

WINDOWS 7 - NOW OBSOLETE

In February 2020, Windows 7 reached end of life. This means that Microsoft will no longer send out security patches so it is open to infiltration from unwanted third parties. Are all your laptops and computers now operating on Windows 10?

STOP USING USB STICKS

Many schools use USB's to transfer work to and from school, or carry laptops full of information. Using a secure cloud account as a main place for storage of all important information, children's data, lesson planning and so on, means that if a laptop or memory stick goes missing, there is no breach of GDPR, and you are able to still access everything you need.

LOOK AFTER YOUR PASSWORDS

How are your staff managing their logins? Are they using the same password for all their applications both at work and at home? Ensuring all staff use a Password Manager will help mitigate this potential security issue.

Simple changes and advice to help reduce the possibility of a security mishap include:

- Advising Staff not to click on links or downloads, especially updates about Corona Virus or other topical subjects
- Check the source of where the e-mail comes from before downloading - are there additional characters in the address, or a different designator to normal - .com instead of .co.uk
- Only use resources from safe, known suppliers.
- Call suppliers to confirm changes to any billing details, don't rely solely on emails
